Associate counters stepping simultaneously

Version 0.8

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1 Introduction

The aim of this package is to provide some additional support for example for a package like totcount.

For example, the total number of pages in a document could be achieved by using

This will work, as long there is no reset of the page counter, as it might happen in the case of **\setcounter** or **\pagenumbering** being applied in the document. The result is a false page counter total value.

This package provides associate counters, i.e. counters that are increased simultaneously with a driver counter and are not influenced by a a resetting of the driver counter, as long as not being added to the reset list by definition of the counter or explicitly by \@addtoreset.

This package defines some macros to handle associated counters. The only interception to the standard behaviour is within the redefined commands **\addtocounter** and **\setcounter**. The usual commands still work, as there is code added to their definition. In a previous version, **\stepcounter** and **\refstepcounter** were redefined, but since these use **\addtocounter** effectively, it was decided to use the basic command.

Internally, the associated counters are stored in one list per counter - it is not recommended to operate on those lists directly.

Please note, that this package does not provide means for simultaneous stepping of counters defined by plain T_{EX} mewcount command.

2 Package options

As of version 0.8 the package has only one option, regarding the suspending of counters globally, regardless, whether they are drivers or associated counters (more on this facility of the package, see 5).

globalsuspend= $\langle true/false \rangle$

(initially false)

If this key is set to $\langle true \rangle$, a general driver can be set to the suspended list, i.e, it is not updated via **\addtocounter**. If unsure, do not use this option or say explicitly

\usepackage[globalsuspend=false]{assoccnt}

3.2 Incompatibilities

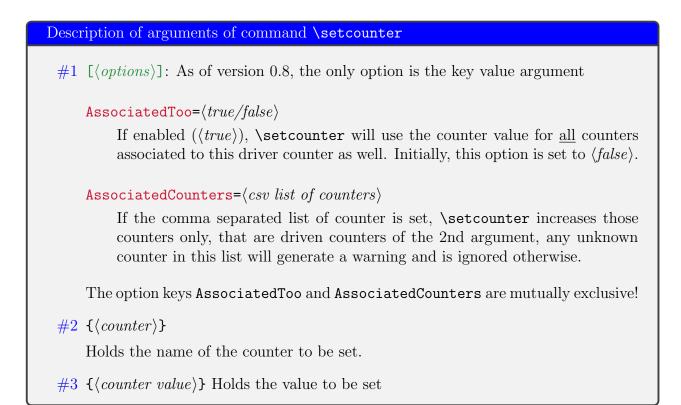
- This package does not work really well with the \boxtimes calc package. Load \boxtimes calc before \boxtimes assoccnt!
- This package does not work together when the Package \boxtimes **xifthen** is included. As of version 0.8 I could not figure out, where the strange behaviour comes in. It's most likely an incompatibility between \boxtimes **etoolbox** and \boxtimes **xifthen**

4 Documentation of Macros

4.1 Redefined standard commands

$\ensuremath{\set\counter[\langle options \rangle]} {\counter \value \rangle}$

This command behaves like the standard macro **\setcounter**, but has an additional optional 1st argument. This optional argument can be used to enable the setting of the driver counter value as well as the associated counter values at once.



4.2 Associated counters commands

All macros have the general rule, that the driver counter is specified as 1st argument to the macro.

 $\DeclareAssociatedCounters[\langle options \rangle] \{\langle driver \ counter \rangle\} \{\langle associated \ counters \ list \rangle\}$

This command is the main macro of the package. It declares the counter names being specified in comma - separated - list (CSV) which should be stepped simultaneously when the driver counter is increased by *stepcounter*.

Description of arguments of command \DeclareAssociatedCounters

- #1 [$\langle options \rangle$]: As of 0.8, the optional argument [$\langle options \rangle$] is not used so far, but is reserved for later purposes.
- #2 { $\langle driver \ counter \rangle$ }

Holds the name of the driver counter to which the list of counters should be associated

#3 { $\langle associated \ counters \ list \rangle$ }

A comma separated list of counter names that should be associated to the driver counter

- This command will be a preamble command in future
- This command should be used as early as possible, i.e. in the preamble of the document, since the driven counters are not increased as long as they are not associated to the driver counter. On the hand, it is possible, to control the starting point of the association at any position in the body of the document, when the association should start later on.

- Current version state:
 - No checking whether the 2nd and 3rd arguments hold counter names is applied.
 - No check is done whether two (or more) associated counters are mutually associated.
- A self-association of the driver counter to itself is ignored internally as this would lead to inconsistent counter values.
- The order of the specification of associated counters in the 2nd arguments is of no importance.
- Specifing an associated counter name multiple times has no effect, only the first occurence of the name will be used.

 $AddAssociatedCounters[\langle options \rangle] \{\langle driver \ counter \rangle\} \{\langle associated \ counters \ list \rangle\}$

This command adds some counters to the associated counter list for a specific driver counter – if this list does not exists, the $\square T_E X$ run will be stopped. You have to use $\DeclareAssociatedCounters^{\rightarrow P.}$ first, to set up the driver counter hook.

Description of arguments of command \AddAssociatedCounters		
#1 [$\langle options \rangle$]: As of 0.8, the optional argument [$\langle options \rangle$] is not used so far, but is reserved for later purposes.		
#2 { $\langle driver \ counter \rangle$ }		
Holds the name of the driver counter to which the list of counters should be associated		
#3 { $(associated \ counters \ list)$ }		
A comma separated list of counter names that should be associated to the driver counter		

This command removes a counter from the existing list for a driver counter, i.e. the counter will not be increased any longer by **\stepcounter**. It can be increased however manually, of course.

This document has 24 (beware: 20) pages.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{NemoveAssociatedCounters}} \{ \langle driver \ counter \rangle \} \{ \langle list \ of \ associated \ counters \rangle \} \}$

This command removes the comma-separated-value list of counters from the existing list for a driver counter, i.e. the counters will not be increased any longer by **\stepcounter**. They can be increased however manually, of course.

Take care not to confuse the commands $\RemoveAssociatedCounters^{\rightarrow P.6}$ and $\RemoveAssociatedCounter^{\rightarrow P.6}$

 $ClearAssociatedCounters{ driver counter }$

This command clears the internal list for all counters associated to the $\{\langle driver \ counter \rangle\}$. The counters will not be increased automatically.

4.3 Driver counter commands

 $\Lambda ddDriverCounter[\langle options \rangle] \{\langle driver \ counter \ name \rangle\}$

Description of arguments of command **\AddDriverCounter**

#1 [$\langle options \rangle$]: As of 0.8, the optional argument [$\langle options \rangle$] is not used so far, but is reserved for later purposes.

#2 { $\langle driver \ counter \ name \rangle$ }

Holds the name of the driver counter that should be added to the list of driver counters.

ClearDriverCounter[(options)]

This clears completely the list of driver counters, such that no counters are regarded as being associated – i.e. no driver is hold as being a driver counter. The optional argument is not used as of version 0.8.

4.4 Commands for queries

Sometimes it might be necessary to get information, whether a counter is regarded as a driver or as an associated counter. This section describes some query macros in order to obtain this information.

 $\label{eq:associatedToCounter} (driver counter) {(associated counter)} {(True branch)} {(False branch)}$

This macro checks, whether a counter is associated to a particular given driver counter and expands the corresponding branch. If the internal driver counter list does not exist, the false branch will be used, since this also means, that the possibly associated counter is not associated at all.

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Holds the name of the driver counter to which {\associated counter\} the could possibly be associated. #2 {\associated counter\} Contains the name of the possibly associated counter. #3 {\True branch\} This code is expanded if the counter is associated to the driver, otherwise it is ignored. #4 {\True branch\} This code is expanded if the counter is not associated to the driver, otherwise it is ignored.

Description of arguments of command \IsAssociatedToCounter

No, anotherpages is not associated

#1 { $\langle driver \ counter \rangle$ }

See also

- \bullet **\IsAssociatedCounter** for checking whether a counter is associated
- $\IsDriverCounter^{\rightarrow P.10}$ in order to check whether a counter is a driver.
- \GetDriverCounter ${}^{\rightarrow \mathrm{P.8}}$ returns the driver counter name for a given associated counter name
- \AssociatedDriverCounterInfo^{\rightarrow P. 10} prints verbose information to the document (not to the screen!)

 $GetDriverCounter{(counter name)}$

This commands returns the driver counter to which the counter name of the first argument is connected to. If the counter is not defined, the macro returns nothing.

- No check whether the counter name is defined is performed
- No check whether the counter is associated at all is performed. Usage of this command in conjunction with \IsAssociatedCounter^{→P.9} is strongly encouraged.

$IsAssociatedCounter{(counter name)}{(True branch)}{(False branch)}$

This commands tests, whether a given counter name is an associated counter and expands correspondingly the true or the false branch. The command does not tell to which driver the counter it is associated – this information can be obtained by $GetDriverCounter^{\rightarrow P.8}$.

Description of arguments of command \IfAssociatedCounter

#1 { $\langle counter name \rangle$ }

Contains the name of the possibly associated counter

#2 { $\langle True \ branch \rangle$ }

This code is expanded if the counter is associated to a driver, otherwise it is ignored

#3 { $\langle True \ branch \rangle$ }

This code is expanded if the counter is **not** associated a driver, otherwise it is ignored

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No, section counter does not have the associated counter properties Yes, totalpages is an associated counter

 $\IsDriverCounter{\langle driver counter name \rangle}{\langle True branch \rangle}{\langle False branch \rangle}$

This commands tests, whether a given counter name is a driver counter and expands correspondingly the true or the false branch.

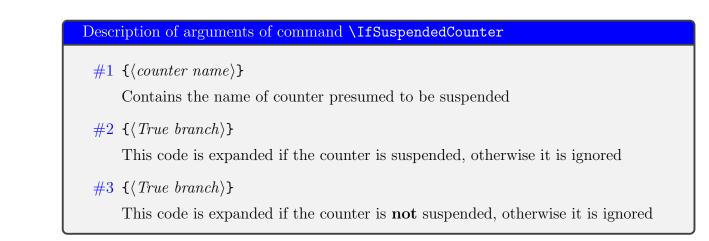
Description of arguments of command \IfDriverCounter
#1 { $\langle driver \ counter \ name \rangle$ } Contains the name of the possible driver counter
#2 { $\langle True \ branch \rangle$ } This code is expanded if the counter is a driver, otherwise it is ignored
#3 { $\langle True \ branch \rangle$ } This code is expanded if the counter is not a driver, otherwise it is ignored

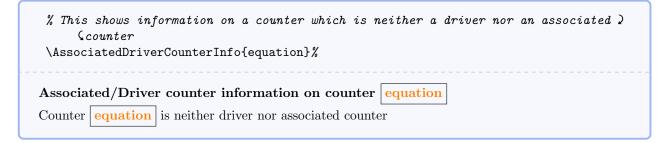
This command checks, whether a counter is suspended, i.e. not updated at all and expands the corresponding branches.



$AssociatedDriverCounterInfo{(counter name)}$

This command is purposed for statistics only, for package/class authors for example and should not be used in a real document, as it generates verbose output to the document.

4.5 Information on counters

On occasions it might be important to have some information which counter has been changed last. Since there are four commands manipulating counter values, there are four corresponding routines for this:

\LastAddedToCounter

This command has no arguments and expands to the name of the counter which was used last in **\addtocounter**. There is no further typesetting done with the countername.

\LastSteppedCounter

This command has no arguments and expands to the name of the counter which was stepped last using **\stepcounter**. There is no further typesetting done with the countername.

\stepcounter{SomeCounter} The last counter being stepped was \PrettyPrintCounterName{\LastSteppedCounter}. The last counter being stepped was SomeCounter.

\LastSetCounter

This command has no arguments and expands to the name of the counter which was set last using $setcounter^{\rightarrow P.3}$. There is no further typesetting done with the countername.

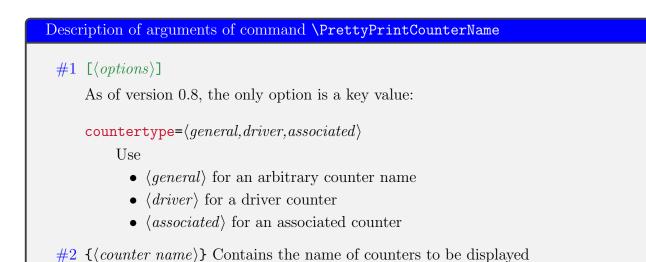
Please note, that all of this commands are only working in the current run of compilation, i.e. <u>after</u> there has been some operation on the counters. They can't be used for information on the last changed counter in a previous run.

4.6 Minor macros

For the informational output on counter properties in conjunction with the macro **\AssociatedDriverCounter** some helper macros have been defined:

\PrettyPrintCounterName[(countertype)]{(counter name)}

This command just prints a counter name with frame. It's meant of informational use only.



Please note, that as of version 0.8, this command does not autodetect the property of the counter nor if the 2nd argument holds a real counter name at all

\GeneralCounterInfoColor

This macro holds the text color for a general counter, it defaults to $\langle orange \rangle$

\DriverCounterInfoColor

This macro holds the text color for a driver counter, it defaults to $\langle blue \rangle$

\AssociatedCounterInfoColor

This macro holds the text color for an associated counter, it defaults to $\langle \textit{red} \rangle$

5 Suspending and resuming associated counters

Rather than remove an associated counter from the list, it is possible to suspend the automatic stepping for a while and then resume it, for example, if the value of a counter should not be stepped within a specific chapter etc.

 $SuspendCounters[\langle options \rangle] \{\langle counters \ list \rangle\}$

Description of arguments of command \SuspendCounters
#1 [⟨options⟩]
Not used so far, reserved for later usages
#2 {⟨counters list⟩}
Contains the name of counters to be suspended, separated by commas (CSV - list)

\ResumeSuspendedCounters

This command has no arguments and revokes the suspension of **all** counters.

Some remarks:

- Please note, that it is possible, to suspend an arbitrary counter, if the package option globalsuspend^{\rightarrow P.2} is set to $\langle true \rangle$. Handle this option with care!
- If a driver counter is suspended, all counters associated to it are suspended too!

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Internals commands 6

Basically spoken, all internal commands use \@@assoccnt@@ as prefix and are designed to be used only within the package. There is no need to call them in a document directly. Nevertheless, the macros are described for completeness. The direct usage is discouraged, however, if needed, they have to included in a makeatletter ... makeatother pair¹.

This command removes an entry (i.e. a counter name) from a general list - it is not connected to the associated counter features at all.

Description of arguments of command \@@assoccnt@@removefromlist

#1 { $\langle list \ command \ sequence \ name \rangle$ }

Contains the name of the list

 $#2 \{\langle entry name \rangle\}$

This argument should contain the name to be removed from the list. If this name is not present, the original list is maintained unchanged.

$\constant \constant \con$

This command generates a list for each associated counter, holding the counter names to which this counter is associated to. As of version 0.8 this list can contain only **one** entry, since a counter cannot not be associated to multiple driver counters.

The only argument {(associated counter name)} holds the name of the associated counter name. The list name is managed internally and should not be redefined.

This is the low level command, that

1. adds a single counter as an associated one to the appropriate list and prevents a multiple addition to this list

¹Well, \makeatother could be omitted, but it is not advised to do so

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- 2. adds a driver counter to the list of driver counters
- 3. prevents multiple addition of the associated counter to other lists

Use the wrapper command **\AddAssociatedCounter** for proper usage.

This command holds the name of the suffix for the associated counters list. It should not be redefined.

- Provide a better internal list organization
- Some macro names might be non-intuitive

- Allow for specific counter to be resumed from suspension instead of resuming all
- Allow for an associated counter to have multiple masters
- Complete redesign and rewrite with \boxtimes expl3 this will provide better list features
